AB 766: Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Access Strategic Plans

AB 766 protects DEIA programs in State government by requiring all departments to undertake a racial equity review of any upcoming regulations to be completed by a person in a DEIA coordinator position or similarly qualified if no position exists.

AB 785: Community Violence Reduction

AB 785 moves money from all future prison closures into permanent funding for community programs that decrease violence and end the school to prison pipeline.

AB 802: Youth Hunger in Juvenile Facilities

AB 802 requires a regular survey of youth nutrition in juvenile custody to provide oversight to condition in youth detention.

AB 829: Parkinson's disease Research Fund

AB 829 establishes the California Parkinson's Disease Research Fund to fund medical research to improve the lives of those living with Parkinson's and continue fighting for a cure.

AB 847: Law Enforcement Oversight Commissions

AB 84 allows law enforcement oversight commission to act on their statutory oversight power by accessing records necessary to investigate misconduct.

AB 860 County Office of Education Oversight:

AB 860 provides County Offices of Education with tools to assist districts in providing meaningful equity information in their Local Control Accountability Plan.

AB 901: Military Spouse Preferential Status

AB 901 permits employers to offer hiring preference and additional credits for any state civil service examination to spouses of active-duty service members.

AB 927: Williams Inspections

AB 927 will extend the annual review for schools to inspect safety, cleanliness, and adequacy of facilities by the 4th week of the school year to the 8th week of the school year in light of increased workload post-COVID.

AB 958: CSU Board of Trustees

AB 958 will enhance faculty representation on the CSU Board of Trustees by requiring the Governor to appoint an additional faculty member to the Board for a total of two faculty appointees.

AB 987: Towing Fees

AB 987 protects Californians against unreasonable tow fees.

AB 1027: Cannabis Testing

AB 1207 allows the Department of Cannabis Control (DCC) regulatory oversight over the testing of cannabis products to enhance consumer protection.

AB 1100: Victim Compensation Board Access

AB 1100 will expand the list of crime victims eligible to receive compensation from the Victim Compensation Board.

AB 1148: Safer Food Packaging

AB 1148 will prohibit the sale and manufacturing of food packaging that contains chemicals that increase the risk of breast cancer.

AB 1211: CalFresh Eligibility

AB 1211 protects CalFresh benefits from potential federal cuts and commissions a study on increased benefits and eligibility expansion.

AB 1279: Youth Three Strike Reform

AB 1279 allows for judicial discretion to undo sentence enhancements for youth offenders that were not provided a jury trial.

AB 1324: CalWORKs Eligibility

AB 1324 increases access to CalWORKs benefits for self-employed workers, workers who work more than 100 hours and workers fighting for improved labor conditions while also ensuring CalWORKs benefits are focused on jobs that will elevate families out of poverty.

AB 1371: Right to Refuse Unsafe Work Conditions

AB 1371 allows workers to refuse unsafe work with full pay and without retaliation when they have reasonable concerns about employer health and safety violations.

AB 1411: Voter Education

AB 1411 requires counties that have not chosen to expand election access to provide a Voter Education and Outreach Plan that provides information about candidates and local measures to better inform voters.

AB 1433: Community College Funding

AB 1433 provides funding to Continuing Education Centers to help with provide essential student resources like food and housing, support students with disabilities, and provide mental health services.

AB 1254: Government Spot Bill 1
